JOHN KIDD



John Murray Kidd was born September 19, 1948, and was laid to rest June 13, 1972. He was the oldest of three kids to Murray and Lena Kidd. During his youth, John was an avid hunter and fisherman. He played American Legion baseball, and in high school, baseball and basketball. His true calling was baseball, and he spent most of his basketball time "riding pine" as John used to put it. After high school graduation in 1966, he went to The University of Montana and played baseball as a walk-on his Freshman year. The other three years he was given a full ride scholarship from the U of M. John graduated in Wildlife Biology, specializing in Fish Biology. He was drafted by the Pittsburgh Pirates right after college graduation as a pitcher, and played in the minor leagues for two years. Roberto Clemente of the Pittsburgh Pirates took John under his wing, and mentored him for those two years. Due to injury, he was released from the Pirates. He came home and was an assistant baseball coach under Lyle Smith for Boise State University. That summer he worked for Sawtooth Logging Company, and a logging accident took him from us. John was survived by his parents Murray and Lena Kidd; his siblings Bruce and Christy Kidd, and a son James Kidd.

Tiger Softball Stats – 2007 - 2010

101 wins in 4 years!

The team scored 842 runs during a four-year period, an average of 8 runs scored per game for the 4 years.

In 2010, the team batting average was .444. The team outscored their opponents by 239 runs during the 2010 season. They won by an average score of 9-1.

2009-Team showed a huge jump in production which led to the state championship.

Run production increased by 2 per game. Hit totals increased by 56 and batting average increased by 50.

The team decreased their strike out totals every year for 4 years. At the start of 2007, strikeout average was 6.5 per game and by 2010, the strikeout average was 3 per game.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Staff member who taught or coached at MHHS for at least five (5) years and who are no longer at the school.
- Staff member who after leaving or retiring from MHHS has given back to the school through service and volunteering.
- Staff members who have brought honor and distinction to MHHS.
- Staff members whose contributions to the school positively impacted either staff or students.
- Students must have graduated from MHHS five (5) years prior to being nominated.
- Student athlete's contributions and letters in all sports are taken into consideration.
- Nominee must be "worthy" and "outstanding" individuals for consideration, not just the best athlete.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Contributions to the total athletic program and school in the areas of service to the school, attitude, citizenship, leadership, school spirit, and scholarship will be taken into account.
- Committee considers the candidates total body of work, including current standings and worthiness in society.
- Other factors may be considered for all nominations.
- There is no automatic selection in the Hall of Fame, but factors such as success in multiple sports, four year letter winners in a single sport, individual and team championships, collegiate All American level, & contributions to society as a MHHS grad will weigh strongly in the selection committee.

STEVE KENT

When I was six years old, my family moved to Mtn. Home in the summer of 1957 from Boise. My father had been named the agent for the Union Pacific Railroad Depot in Mtn. Home. My first organized competition in sports started in the Mtn. Home recreation baseball program. Some of my best memories were playing and coaching baseball each summer.

When I was in the 6th grade, Father Quinn started a Catholic basketball team after he built the Catholic Hall and it had a gym on the top floor. It was an 8th grade team, but I was lucky enough to be the point guard and we played teams from all over southern Idaho in a Catholic league. The next year we played 9th grade teams, and I fondly remember when we beat the Mtn. Home high school sophomore team in a fall game scrimmage. I was hooked on basketball.

In the 8th grade I switched to high school sports which is the year interscholastic sports started for Mtn. Home school teams. We were playing in the Boise Jr. High league and won the league championship that year and finished second our freshmen year. As sophomores, we won the District 3 sophomore championship. The summer of 1962, I played second base on the Elmore County Legion baseball team and we were state runner-up to the powerful Lewiston team. After my junior year, a couple of key players moved away, but as seniors we still managed to finish 3rd in the District tournament.

As a junior, I placed 2nd to the great Lynn Hills of Nampa in the State Cross Country championship, running a time of 19:41 over the two-mile course. My senior year (1969), I was 2nd in the mile run at the state meet, breaking the school record that was held by George Shyrock. My time was 4:29.1 which still stands as the school record.

I was awarded a full ride scholarship to play basketball at the University of Idaho. I played point guard for the freshman team. I transferred to Boise State University, and later played one season at College of Idaho.

Over my career, I was a Math teacher and Varsity basketball coach at the Airbase Jr. High, Nyssa and Vale Oregon, Lakeland, Mtn. Home, Richfield, and Arco. We qualified for state twice at Nyssa, and once at Vale. At Richfield as the girl’s coach we were state champions in 2007, 2009, and 2010. In 2011, we were state runner-ups. I then switched back to coaching boys’ basketball in Arco, and we were state champions in 2013.

My greatest pride is to have had the opportunity to coach my children, Michelle, Teenie, Sasha, and Steve Jr, and for all of them to have won state championships. I want to thank my daughter Lacy Kent and her children, Collin and Adelyn, Michelle and her daughter, Ariya, Teenie and her husband, Chris, Sasha and her fiancé, Chance, and Steve Jr. for all their support over the years.
