**SUBJECT:** General information about MHHS Driver Education 2017-2018

**Applications will be taken and processed on a first-come first-served basis. The first students to get their paperwork in, class fee paid, and permit purchased will be enrolled in the class each session. Early registration is highly recommended. **Classes usually fill 4-8 weeks before the start date.****

**Use the chart below to determine which session you would like to be in and get your application in and class fee paid before the last day the application/class fee is due for that session. Once you receive a letter/e-mail of acceptance, make sure you purchase your driving permit within the designated dates.**

The minimum requirements and regulations governing the driver education program are:

1. To be eligible for the after school course, a student must be at least 14 and ½ years of age when they go to get their driving permit.
2. If completion is successful, notation will be made in the student's school records; however, no high school credit is given for this course.
3. The law requires that each student enrolling into driver's education obtain a driver's training permit. This permit must be purchased at the sheriff's office within the designated date range to **buy a permit for that session.** Signature of one parent witnessed by the Sheriff or deputy is required for the issuance of this permit. **One natural parent or legal guardian must accompany the student when they apply for the permit. Proof of age is required; the applicant must bring a State certified birth certificate, Social Security card, a pictured ID card and a letter of verification from the school district that they are in for that school year that they apply for the permit.** The fee for this permit is \$21.50 and must be paid in cash. The office hours for obtaining permits are from **8:30 to 4:00 Monday through Friday.** Because of the limited number of students to be enrolled, early registration is encouraged. Once you receive your letter of acceptance, check the above schedule to see when you

need to get your permit. **Don't get left out because you failed to get your permit in time. If you fail to pay the class fee and purchase your permit during time, you will not be permitted to take the class. Remember only a certain number of students will be allowed in each session. The student is also required to pay a Driver Education fee of \$165.00 to Mountain Home High School. THIS FEE MUST BE PAID AT THE HIGH SCHOOL OFFICE BEFORE A PERMIT CAN BE PURCHASED.**

4. You will receive an acceptance letter or e-mail after your application has been processed. This letter/e-mail will have the deadline dates for payment of the class fee and permit purchase (SEE LAST LINE OF ITEM 3 ABOVE).
5. The students will take an eye examination while at the Sheriff's office, so if you wear glasses, bring them with you. If you suspect a vision problem, please see a doctor prior to application. The permit cannot be issued until the problem is corrected.
6. Students must use their full legal name and give a correct address. If a Post Office Box is used, the street address must also be given. If a Rural Route number is used, a street description such as Canyon Creek Road, etc. must be given.
7. The Driver Training Permit is a learner's permit and allows driving **only** with a certified Driver Education Instructor. This is the State Law. This permit will then be given to one of your parents for supervised instruction period after the course has been completed.
8. The minimum requirements for completion of the course will include 30 hours of classroom instruction, not less than 6 hours of behind the wheel instruction, and a minimum of 6 hours of in the car observation learning.
9. All driver education vehicles are equipped with dual brake controls.
10. The Mountain Home School District will carry adequate insurance as provided by law.
11. The Driver Education program will be conducted at the Mountain Home High School in Room 34, Mountain Home Junior High Room 214, or Mountain Home Junior High Room 213.
12. If you cannot complete the program in the days outlined, please **do not submit an application, as regular attendance at all scheduled sessions is mandatory.**
13. You will receive a letter/e-mail verifying your acceptance into the class at least 3 weeks prior to the class start date.
